The story time picture book is "We Are Grateful: Otsaliheliga," written by Cherokee Nation citizen Traci Sorell and illustrated by Frane Lessac. The word otsaliheliga, pronounced oh-jah-LEE-hay-lee-gah, is used by members of the Cherokee Nation to express gratitude every day and every season.

The award-winning book underscores the importance of traditions and how celebrating gratefulness can be healing. It was selected by and will be read by "Ms. Carol," Carol Robinson, GLADL youth services librarian.
