LAFCU is seeking seniors attending high school in Michigan to participate in our annual Write to Educate essay contest. Students attending **an accredited college or university in the state of Michigan** in the Fall of 2021 should apply.

The Lansing State Journal is a community sponsor of the 2021 Write to Educate Essay Contest. This year's winner(s) essays will be published in the Lansing State Journal.

TASK:

Write a one-page 500 word essay (essays not meeting 500 word count or exceeding one-page will be excluded from scoring)

- Typed in Times New Roman
- 12 point font
- Single spaced
- One-inch margins
- Do not include your name or school name in your essay

TOPIC:

Examine the long-term effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on our society (human interactions, schooling, the economy, tourism, etc.).

GRADING:

Students will be graded using a 1-10 point scale with the following criteria:

- Specifically followed the requirements and directions of the essay contest
- Content
- Correct spelling/grammar
